Getting prepared for school

School uniform

We advise you to buy your child's school uniform as early as possible in the school shop (also referred to as the Schulshop) or online: https://shop.dsk.co.za/

Second-hand clothes can be bought at the school shop as well.

Sports clothes

Different sports clothes are required depending on your child's grade.

Primary School

All Grade 1-4 learners come to school in their sports clothes on the days they have their sports lessons. Each child is assigned to the red or blue team upon enrolment.

- Please always pack DSK swimwear, DSK cap, swimming goggles and towel in term 1 and 4
- Long or short sports pants and a blue or red sports t-shirt
- Sports jacket
- Solid sports shoes

Middle and High School

All Grade 5 - 12 learners are allowed to wear sports clothes on their way to/from school if/when they have sports in the first or last two lessons of their school day.

Swimming in term 1 and 4:

- DSK swimwear, DSK cap, swimming goggles and towel
- Short-/long-sleeved lycra top with school logo (optional)

Any other sports lessons:

- Sports tops are white shirts with blue and red inserts from the school shop
- School sports shorts
- White, dark blue or black socks
- Solid sports shoes
- School tracksuit (optional)

We strongly advise you to mark all items of your child with their full name and class!

Teaching materials and books from Grade 2 onwards

After Grade 1 local teaching books and stationary materials will have to be ordered online with the Western Cape School Suppliers (www.wcapess.co.za).

In October of each school year, a list of all necessary materials will be published via Skooler (DSK communication app). In general, the order deadline is at the end of October.

German textbooks are provided by the school and are sold to the learners. The amount will be added to the school account.

Supervision in the mornings (for Primary School learners)

A teacher will supervise the Primary School playground from 07:30h in the mornings. Please do not drop off your child/children earlier than 07:30h, as there will be no supervision beforehand.

Breakfast/lunchbox

It is important to us that all children enjoy a healthy breakfast and healthy snacks.

Please prepare a lunchbox (with fruit, whole-wheat bread, yoghurt, etc.) and a reusable bottle with preferably just water. Please don't give your children any drinks with added sugar or caffeine (such as coke, fruit juice, ice-tea). At school, there are several drinking fountains with filtered water for everybody to refill their water bottles at any time. It is our goal to avoid waste, especially plastic. All containers/packages that need to be disposed of at school need to be recyclable and be thrown into the relevant bins.

Cafeteria Linga Longa (lunch)

The Linga Longa Cafeteria (on the upper level of the school property) offers lunch, a salad bar and dessert daily from Monday to Thursday.

The daily changing lunch menu can be viewed on Skooler under "Resources" or on the DSK Parent Info Portal. We also offer a vegetarian option every day (https://www.parents.dsk.co.za/school-life/elunch-cafeteria/).

Tuckshop

A variety of drinks, snacks and takeaway meals is available (microwaves are available to reheat food). The tuckshop menu can be found on the DSK Parent Info Portal.

eLunch card/student ID card

eLunch is a cashless payment system for the cafeteria and the tuckshop. Parents can upload money online to their child's individual account and can select which items their child may purchase. Learners can then pay with their student ID card.

Extramurals at the main campus

We offer a broad range of extramurals (also known as AGs) at our school. They range from sport activities to musical, social, cultural to arts and crafts activities. All extramurals require registration in advance. The online registration form will be sent out via Skooler. Please complete the form within the first week of term. Most extramural classes are free of charge. However, some classes are offered by external service providers and may come at an extra cost. In this case, please contact the relevant coach directly for payment.

Please note, registration is only valid for one term and must be renewed every term. Whenever an extramural has to be cancelled, you will receive a notification via Skooler.

Aftercare at the main campus (also known as NAB)

The DSK offers Grade 1-5 learners the option to stay longer at school in our aftercare programme.

There are different aftercare options you can choose from, with aftercare times until 14:30h, 16:00h or 17:00h. Our aftercare is designed for Grade 1 to 5 learners, and we make the time as valuable and fun as possible. We offer children high-quality activities, but also leave room for free play. Since 2019, we have extended our NAB concept with the German language development concept.

Our aftercare teachers organise the food distribution and supervise the NAB children during lunch in the cafeteria. Our learners can be supervised at school from 12:15h from Mondays to Thursdays and from 11:15h on Fridays. General information (in alphabetical order)

Primary School

In 2024 over 250 learners attended the Primary School of the DSK. The Primary School spans from Grade 1 - 4. There are two campuses, one in Tamboerskloof (main campus) and one in Tygerberg, which is an attractive alternative for German-speaking families from the northern suburbs.

Each grade consists of 3 or 4 classes, where each class is identified with a letter. The a, b and c classes are taught at the main campus and d classes are taught at the Tygerberg campus.

Middle and High School

At the DSK, Grade 5 - 9 learners make up the Middle School. Only in Grade 5 can English speaking children with no prior knowledge of the German language join the DSK. We offer two streams, one for German speakers and one for English speakers from this stage on.

Our Grade 10 - 12 learners attend the High School. Our learners graduate in Grade 12 with one of two double qualifications, depending if they are in the German Stream or English Stream. Both streams offer qualifications which can open doors to international study options and careers.

Absence from school

Sick report

If your child is sick and cannot attend school, please notify the school on the same day before 08:00h by calling the reception on 021 480 3830/1. Please notify the Tygerberg campus on 021 930 6302.

Please note that you will have to call the school every day that your child is absent unless you provide a medical certificate stating sick leave for several days on the first day. From the 3rd day of absence, a medical certificate is required.

Green slip

If your child has to leave school early because of illness or other appointments, he/she needs a green slip that is to be signed by the class or subject teacher of that lesson. Once signed by the teacher, the learner needs to get the slip stamped by the school's secretary. The green slip will need to be presented to security at the gate so that the learner will be allowed to leave the school premises. Please issue your child with a written notice, should you know in advance that he/she will need to leave school earlier that day.

Exemption from school

Extra leave has to be applied for and confirmed by the headmaster **before** you book a flight or holiday etc. Applications with dates that are close to the school holidays are generally not allowed unless there is a special reason. This request must be submitted well in advance in writing and must be approved by the headmaster first. Bilingual lesson (BLU)

The abbreviation BLU stands for "Bilingualer Unterricht" which means bilingual teaching – it is the term for classes held and subjects taught in two languages, in the DSK's case, that is German and English. BLU is done at schools of mutual encounter like the DSK, where learners of various mother tongues meet and are taught together. Our learners, unlike at other schools, are provided with the unique chance of reaching a higher language proficiency in both English and German.

Communication

Guidelines and Code of Conduct

Health and Safety

According to the Health and Safety guidelines for schools, all schools must regularly practise emergencies such as fire alarms and lockdowns with the learners. These exercises are usually announced and discussed in advance with the class teachers, who then explain the procedures to the learners in their classes.

Library

We have a modern two-storey multimedia library with a wide selection of books in German, English, Afrikaans and French as well as many magazines, CDs and DVDs that can be rented out (taken home) for two weeks.

A fee of R500 is charged to the school account at the beginning of each school year, regardless of whether a learner makes use of the library or not.

Music Centre

At the Gisela Lange Music Centre (GLMZ), our learners (as well as parents) can learn to play a wide range of musical instruments, sing, dance and study music theory under the guidance of qualified teachers. The lessons take place by appointment at the GLMZ (upper classrooms of the DSK) in the afternoon and are subject to a charge. Parent Council

The Parent Council consists of all parent representatives of the school. It is an important communication tool for the parents and thus also for their children as the class reps present their interests to the teaching staff as well as the school board and support activities of the school.

Parent evenings

Parent evenings are usually held twice a year (in term 1 and 3). All parents are to meet in the KTS, where important general information is shared. Afterwards, everyone goes to their child's respective classroom together with the class teacher. Invitations are sent out before the parent evening by the class teacher or the parent representative.

Parking

The lower parking lot only allows for a 'drop and go' until 07:40h. Access to the car park below the sports hall is for employees and guests only.

Remedial lessons

Remedial lessons are offered free of charge for various subjects.

Reports

Primary School

Grade 1 and 2 learners will receive a report twice a year, once before the June holidays and once before the December holidays.

It is a written report with statements about your child's learning development as well as work and social behaviour. At the end of Grade 2, the learners receive a mark for German and Mathematics. In Grade 3 and 4, learners will receive certificates with percentages as well as reports about their academic and social behaviour. An English translation will also be enclosed.

Middle and High School

Grade 5 - 12 learners will receive a report twice a year, once before the June holidays and once before the December holidays. Additionally, written feedback is given after term 1 and 3.

School Board

In addition to the school management, the DSK has a School Board consisting of the representatives of the DSK, the German Consul General, the pastor of the St Martini community and selected parents.

Once a year the board invites the whole school community to the Annual General Meeting (AGM). At the AGM, members from the parent body are elected for 2 years to join the school board. All parents who have children at the DSK can stand for election.

School fees

Sports day (Sportfest)

On a Saturday in term 1, the red and the blue teams from Grades 1 - 7 compete against each other at the annual sports day (also known as the Sportfest) in numerous athletic disciplines.

There is also a fun race for parents. The sports day counts as a normal school day, which means that attendance is compulsory. As compensation for the Saturday school day, there will be a day off later in the year.

Bundesjugendspiele

Our Grades 8 - 12 learners will take part in the Bundesjugendspiele during their sports lesson – an athletic competition held by all schools in Germany where athletes have to compete in 3 disciplines from the following categories: running, jumping and throwing. The 6 top girls and boys will compete for the title of "school champion"/"Schulmeister" in these 3 disciplines during the Sportfest.

Star Centre (Learner Support Centre)

The Star Centre supports learners with emotional, social and academic issues. The counselling mainly takes place during the school/class time in specially equipped rooms.

Swimming gala

This event (also known as the Schwimmfest) is usually held on a Thursday and Friday in term 1.

The best swimmers of each grade (Grades 2 - 12) compete against each other. The Grade 1 learners don't actively participate in the swimming gala but rather join in to cheer and watch.

The swimming gala ends with a fun relay.

Parent involvement

There are many ways in which you as a parent can get involved.

The main areas for parents to get involved are **parent representation**, **parent council**, **school board management** and **school events**.

But there are also other ways to actively contribute, such as a **career guidance counsellor** for our senior learners at the **DSK Career Indaba** or as an internship provider or as a supporter of the **DSK Ubuntu Talent Fund**.

Parent representatives

At the first parent evening, each class will elect two parent representatives. They are usually chosen for two years. Those two parents represent the class in the parent council which meets once a month. The parent representatives support the class teacher and usually provide practical help, such as assisting with school trips, organizing class parties, informing and forwarding emails to the parents of the class, etc. The parent representatives will organise another parent evening in the 3rd term if needed.

Parent Council

The Parent Council consists of elected parent representatives who represent their respective classes for two consecutive years. The Parent Council functions as the voice of the parents and by extension, the learners. They address the teaching body and school management board with regards to the interests of parents and learners.

The Parent Council meets on average eight times per year on a Tuesday evening to discuss relevant issues, activities of the various portfolio committees and tasks, which have been undertaken by representatives, for example: sports, events, safety and traffic, aftercare, marketing, social responsibility, art and culture.

School Board

The School Board is the elected representation of the members of the school association and thus the highest body of the school.

There are up to ten voting members on the School Board. Nine of whom are elected at the AGM of the School Association in a two-year cycle, with the tenth member being appointed by the Lutheran Church. The School Board may co-opt up to four additional non-voting members at any time. In addition, a member of the German Consulate takes part in school board meetings as a non-voting member.

The School Board enjoys a close working relationship with school management and school administration, with the principal, the deputy head, as well as the bursar, being part of the school board meetings.

The DSK Bazaar is a parent initiative and the largest school fundraising event of the year. It normally takes place on the 1st or 2nd weekend of November.

Also known as the 'German cultural family fest', it attracts not only the German community in the Cape but also people from all over Cape Town (we have had over 7 000 visitors in previous years). An event of this size is only possible if parents, learners, teachers, sponsors and staff get involved and work closely together, which we have managed to do with great success in the past.

At the parents' discretion, the proceeds go towards upgrading of the school's facilities. We have already funded projects such as soccer cages, a multifunction sports court, interactive whiteboards for classrooms and support of individual learners at school camps or outings.

Our bazaar can only be successful if it is carried by the whole school community. It is a mandatory school day for all learners and teachers. The parents prepare and organize the various stands, and actively participate in their class stand on the day.

At the beginning of each school year, two bazaar representatives are elected during the first parent evening. Their role is to organize and coordinate their fellow class parents to make their stand as successful as possible. Some meetings with all bazaar representatives are planned, with the first one scheduled to take place in April annually.

If you like project planning, enjoy working in a team and have some spare time to get involved, it would be wonderful to have you on board as a bazaar representative. We ask all parents for their active support, be it as a bazaar representative, a member of the bazaar committee or as an active helper at your class stand.

DSK PARKING/TRAFFIC GUIDELINES

To ensure everybody's safety, please be aware of and follow the suggested one-way system during peak times:

- Do not drop off, pick up, park or wait on the pedestrian crossings this also applies to the adjacent areas with zigzag lines.
- Do not park or wait at intersections, especially Bay View and Upper Albert, as this seriously disrupts traffic flow.
- Remember that the bus bay is reserved for the school busses only.
- Allow adequate time for your journey.
- Bear in mind that the whole area around the DSK is a school zone, with many small and easily distracted children. PLEASE DRIVE SLOWLY!

With regards to parking, please note:

- The parking area inside, past the main gate, is reserved for staff members and guests only.
- The lower parking area, adjacent to the main gate, has 10 spaces marked and reserved for teachers in the upper section. These spaces are for the exclusive use of teaching staff until 13:00h that means no stopping, waiting, dropping-off or parking there. One additional bay in the lower section is reserved for motorcycles.
- The lower parking areas marked by yellow lines adjacent to the steps and by the gate leading down to the sports field are to be kept clear in order to provide easy and unobstructed pedestrian access.
- The speed limit throughout the DSK campus is 15 km/h.


With regards to **pedestrian traffic**, please remember to always use the two crossings that are on either side of the main gate and to enter the DSK property through the pedestrian entrance.
