How do I purchase my child's local textbooks and stationery?

- Please be aware that late orders can cause delays in delivery of textbooks as the new year often brings a stock shortage of certain items.

The book and stationery packs (ordered before the cut of date) will be handed out at school at the end of the year in the small hall. Those that do not order on time will have to collect their items from WCSS in Maitland.

Does the library sell any stationery supplies?

The library sells a selection of books and stationery supplies. In particular:

 Re-usable Plastic book covers, fountain pens, Tintenkiller, fountain pen refill cartridges, compasses, protractors and the Pelikan watercolours (12 and 24 colours).

What about the books from Germany?
